

### **Career Centers**

At Goodwill of North Georgia, our mission is a simple one: We put people to work. We provide job training, placement, case management, work supports, paid internships, and opportunities to anyone who wants it. With the support of donors, shoppers, and community partners, we help people overcome barriers to employment. Last calendar year 2023, we helped connect 24,736 of our neighbors with jobs. Since the year 2000, Goodwill's career center team have increased the number of jobseekers served by 1,972.6%, even through the pandemic recovery. With the support of our 5,000 current employment partners, Goodwill graduates are placed in top companies with opportunities for growth. We are grateful to our partners who make our mission possible.


### Youth Employment Services (Y.E.S.)

#### PROGRAM






